If your business has fewer than 750 employees including it's affiliated companies and operates in American Samoa or supports our local economy, this program was created with you in mind. Whether you're just starting out or growing something great, we're here to help.

How can it help my business?

You can apply for a loan to support working capital, construction, real estate, or equipment purchases. While it's not a grant, we offer technical assistance to help you become bank-ready and move forward with confidence.

How do I participate?

Visit TBAS and speak with a loan officer. If you're ready, they'll walk you through the application process. If you need some guidance first, the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) can help you get the tools and support to prepare.
